

A Clean, Fine-looking, and Developed School

Dr. Fathi Saad, Governor of Giza, honored the winning schools in the competition, " A Clean, Fine-looking, and Developed School", for which was allocated an annual sum of Two Hundred Thousand Pounds , which are to be awarded to schools, having obtained advanced positions. Agouza, Department acquired the first and second position.

While " Al Orman Tanta Secondary School for Girls , Agouza, won the first position, hence a prize of 10 thousand pounds. Six schools won the second position, and each was awarded five thousand pounds .

Ten schools filled the third position and each school was awarded four thousand pounds. Another thirty seven schools were awarded financial wards; and ten schools were granted certificates of estimate .

The Governor in his speech which was delivered on his behalf by Major General Mohamed Yassin , his deputy .

Major General Yassin , said that educational institutions represent the most important in the community.

And that the State gives special attention to their importance, as they serve in the upbringing and education of our youth , as well as the formation of their skills with the aim of construing a better future for Egypt.

The fourth position was won by 10 schools, each school was awarded Four thousands pounds, Agouza Primary Common school in El Wahat, Mohamed Aly El Berery in Atfeeh, Al Gihad primary in Al Ayat, Al Orman secondry for girls in Dokki, Om Al Abtal primary pilot school in Al Omrania, Atfih for boys in Atfih, Al Saf secondry common, Abou Bakr El Sedik pilot in south Giza, Gamal Ahmad Abdel Baki common in El Badrashin and Imbaba secondary military school for boys in north Giza.

The fourth position was awarded to ten schools with three thousand pounds for each. These are Mubarak secondary pilot in 6th October city, Al Kadaya secondry school in Atfih, Nahia primary Modern school in Oussim, Dr. Mahmoud Omar secondary school for girls in Al Haram, Al Hawamdia primary school for boys in Al Hawamdia, Al Sisil elementary common school in Al Haram, El Sayeda Khadiga elementary school in Al Agouza, Meat Rahina

Primary school for boys in Al Badrasheen, Al Sabee elementary school in October city and Embaba secondary school for girls in north Giza.

The fifth position was awarded to ten schools with each awarded two thousand pounds ,namely Gamal Abdel Nasser secondary school for girls, in Dokki, Om Al Abtal secondary school for girls in Al Omrania, Magdy Okasha primary school in Al Saf, Abou Ghaleb secondary school in Mounshaat Al Kanater, Shobrament primary school in Abou Al Nemres, Samir Akrab for essential education in Monshaat Al Kanater, Omar Ebn El Khatab pilot school in Al Hawamdia, Nogoue Al Arab secondary school in Al Saf, Om El Moemenin secondary school for girls in Al Omrane and Al Warak secondary common school in Al Warak.
