(1) Thracians exhibition extended as well as opening hours

Due to popular demand the exhibition <<The Thracians - Orpheus' Golden Empire>> has been extended to 9 January 2005. This extension also affects the opening dates and duration of subsequent exhibitions. The opening hours for all shows on exhibit have been changed according to those of the Tutankhamun exhibition. All exhibitions are open on Mondays from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., from Tuesday to Sunday 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. During the holidays, the exhibition hall and ice rink will be open from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. On December 24th, however, only from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. On December 31st, the Art and Exhibition Hall as well as the ice rink are closed.

(2) Tutankhamun exhibition lecture series

The exhibition <<Tutankhamun - The Golden Beyond>> has awakened interest in modern Egypt. In order to impart a deeper understanding of the current social and political conditions in the country, the Art and Exhibition Hall has organized a lecture series to take place between January and April in which first-hand information will be provided. Ambassadors, professors, journalists and high-standing members of the foreign ministry will offer an intimate view to the various aspects of modern Egyptian society. In January two of nine lectures will be held in English, each at 7 p.m.:

(3) Tickets for the New Year's concert still available

Slavic and Viennese music will fill the Forum of the Federal Art and Exhibition Hall on 1 January 2005 at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. The Great Philharmonic Orchestra of Poland will greet the New Year under the direction of Dariusz Mikulski and with the solo performance of Katarzyna Mycka. Director Dariusz Mikulski has been awarded numerous international competition prizes and works, among other things, with the Berlin Symphonics and the Silesian Katowice Philharmonic. His orchestra, the Great Philharmonic of Poland, was founded in Walbrzych (Waldenburg) and is characterized by an exceptionally rich repertoire of Slavic and Viennese music. The New Year's concert programme includes popular melodies composed by Johann Strauß and Johannes Brahms, Ney Rosuaro and Giuseppe Verdi.

(4) Long Tutankhamun Nights as of January once a month

-

A pleasurable encounter with Egyptian culture will be provided by the first TUT-Night exclusively for ArtCard-Members on 15 January 2004 at 9.30 p.m. The Art and Exhibition Hall has organized an attractive and varied programme which includes events, music culinary pleasures, and of course short guided tours through the successful exhibition. The ice rink will also be opened until 11 p.m. Holders of the ArtCard will as usual have free entrance. Those who would like to be accompanied by more than one person may buy tickets at the box office upon presentation of the ArtCard. The ArtCard is also available for sale on this evening. Besides 20-minute short guided tours, other events will take place such as <<Hieroglyphics for Beginners>> and presentations on cosmetics, perfume tests and love oaths in the event titled <<Place myrrhe on thy head and clothe thyself in rich garments>>.

ArtCard cooperation partners from Bonn and the entire Rhine-Line, such as the Deutsche Museum Bonn, the Cologne Philharmonic, the Kunstsammlung Nordrhein-Westfalen (K20 und K21) or the Lehmbruck-Museum in Duisburg will be represented by a stand in the Federal Art and Exhibition Hall and will provide information on their programme and services. Shopping to one's heart's desire is possible in the Book Store, in the Museum Shop and at the sale stand in the Foyer. Additional Long Nights are planned for 12 February, 12 March and 9 April for all those interested.

(5) Second edition of the bag production

On 22 December a new special edition of hand bags will appear made from advertisement banners of previous exhibitions. Three different models will be on sale decorated with nine different exhibition motifs, available at the sale stand in the Foyer together with other products from the Tutankhamun exhibition. Also on sale are chocolate lollipops and coffins carrying the portrait of the Egyptian pharaoh produced by the Chocolate Museum Cologne, as well as catalogues from previous exhibitions at special prices.

Those still looking for appropriate Christmas gifts should consider buying an annual card for the Federal Art and Exhibition Hall for those who are friends of culture: The card is valid for 12 months, costs 76 Euro or 71 Euro in subscription. It guarantees free entrance for two persons and two children under 14 years of age, and includes a series of privileges. **This includes entrance to exhibitions without waiting periods – such as the Tutankhamun show.**
